Recycled Water Carter Permit Application

This permit application if approved, will allow the permit holder and vehicle registration number only to cart either Class A or Class B & C recycled water from Western Water's recycled water standpipes to **Customers Who Hold a Current "Temporary Recycled Water Supply Agreement"**.

No recycled water will be supplied without a current permit.

You will be required to have a site induction at the standpipe prior to a permit issue.

Terms and Conditions of the Permit

The permit holder must:

- Only take recycled water from a Western Water recycled water standpipe as nominated, or as varied by Western Water from time to time.
- Display the “Recycled Water Carter Permit” sticker on the tanker in a prominent location for easy recognition by Western Water staff and the public respectively.
- Have completed an OH&S site induction by Western Water staff.
- Not cart potable drinking water in the same container.
- Not cart Class A recycled water in the same container as Class B or C.

Any tanks that have a direct hose to standpipe connection must have a suitable Backflow Prevention Device fitted to the tank.

The permit holder may be subject to an audit by Western Water or the EPA at any time.

Failure to comply with the permit may result in cancellation of the permit. It could also result in a contravention under Section 289 of the Water Act 1989. “A Notice of Contravention” can lead to a prosecution.

The permit is not transferable to any other person or vehicle.

The permit is valid until the expiry date.

The permit does not derogate from any other rights, conditions or powers Western Water has under the Water Act 1989.

General Occupational Health and Safety Guidance Notes

Always wash hands immediately after being in contact with recycled water. If splashed in the eyes, wash immediately with clean water. Avoid any unnecessary contact with recycled water.

It is recommended that drivers and workers be inoculated with Hepatitis A & B

Do not consume food or drink while working with recycled water. Wash hands with fresh water before eating or smoking and finishing work.

Report any skin rashes and illness such as fever, nausea, vomiting or diarrhoea to the supervisor who will report to OH&S professionals.

Cover any wounds after washing with soap and fresh water, with a waterproof dressing to prevent contact with recycled water.

If you have dermatitis, chronic illness or are receiving treatment that may suppress your immune system, then you need to obtain medical advice regarding your fitness to work with recycled water.

On completion of filling or emptying, drain hose and return hose to secure position and ensure that there is no risk of it being used for drinking purposes.
