

Grant Street sewer pump station

Plans and detailed engineering designs for the Grant Street sewer pump station and sewer rising main are continuing. We're expecting these to be completed in the coming weeks and we will provide further information at this point.

Meanwhile, pre-construction work to relocate the power lines in Peelmans Lane Reserve will begin in March.

What does this project involve?

We're upgrading the existing sewer pump station in the reserve at the corner of Grant Street and Peelmans Lane.

This involves deep excavation to install pumps into an underground structure, and an electrical fit out which includes an above ground electrical cabinet.

We'll also construct a new 8 km sewer rising main alongside Grant Street, Parwan Road and Bacchus Marsh-Geelong Road.

Once complete, the pump station will receive sewage from the existing sewerage network and pump it via the new sewer main to the Bacchus Marsh Recycled Water Plant in Parwan for treatment.

What are we up to?

Plans are progressing with the sewer pump station and sewer rising main. Detailed engineering designs are expected in the coming weeks. We'll provide you with more information at this point.

In the meantime, pre-construction work to relocate the power lines in Peelmans Lane Reserve are scheduled to start in the coming weeks.

What will the pre-construction work involve?

As you may be aware, we need to relocate overhead power lines at the site of the new sewer pump station. This is to ensure the safety of the people who will be working on the project.

As the power lines are assets of Powercor, they will be completing these works.

To allow Powercor staff to relocate the power lines to the new alignment, we needed to prepare the site for the work. This involved pruning some of the trees in Peelmans Lane Reserve.

The pruning work was completed by a qualified arborist last year, in accordance with Powercor guidelines. Western Water is currently awaiting sign off from Powercor for the associated works.

As it has been some months since the initial pruning works, there may be some additional minor pruning required before relocation works commence. The extent of the pruning will be in line with the previously communicated and approved works.

Approval will be sought from Moorabool Shire Council if minor pruning is required. Any pruning will be completed by a qualified arborist on Western Water's behalf.

Where will the power line relocation works take place?

At Peelmans Lane Reserve between Peelmans Lane and the Werribee River near Grant Street.

When will the power line relocation work happen?

If required, the minor pruning of the trees will commence within the next four weeks.

Powercor will then realign the overhead power lines. Proofing for this work is scheduled to begin within the next three weeks.

The relocation of the power lines is planned to happen on Saturday 18 March. This is expected to take less than two days.

Working hours

Powercor's working hours are between 7:30am and 3:30pm.

What impacts can I expect during the works?

Powercor will keep construction impacts to a minimum, however the following are likely to occur:

Traffic


For your safety, and that of the team, traffic management will be in place. This includes vehicle traffic and pedestrian traffic in the area.

Noise and Dust

During construction, you will hear construction noise and see dust coming from the site.

Driveways

There may be a requirement to restrict access to driveways when running



conductors. If your driveway is going to be impacted, Powercor will speak with you directly.

Visual

You can expect to see large machinery including cranes during construction. Fencing and barricades will also be used at the work site to ensure your safety.

Will electricity to my property be affected?

There is likely to be a short period where your power supply may be impacted.

Affected properties will be notified in advance by Powercor.

Where will the power lines and poles be located?

To relocate the power lines, Powercor has advised they will:

- install two new power poles in the reserve: (1) near the Werribee

River east of the current pole; and (2) near the corner of the road and 2a Peelmans Lane;

- upgrade the existing power pole in Peelmans Lane opposite 1 Peelmans Lane; and
- upgrade the existing power pole in Peelmans Lane alongside 80 Grant Street.

Upgrading a power pole involves replacing the existing pole with a taller one and substituting low voltage powerlines with main backbone feeders.
